
Infection with rabies virus

First round of comments

- > Full revision (ad hoc Group and Commissions)
- Dog-mediated rabies case definition
- Zoning approach
- Country or zone free from
 - Rabies
 - Dog-mediated rabies
- Animal movements (trade recommendations)
- OIE endorsed official control programme for dog-mediated rabies
- > Surveillance








Terrestrial Code Chapter 7.7.

Stray dog population control

- Recommendations to deal with stray and feral dogs
- Integral part of rabies elimination programme
- Controlling dog populations without causing unnecessary animal suffering
- Veterinary Services should play a lead role



The new version



- Update existing diagnostic tests
- Include direct rapid immunohistochemistry test (dRIT)
- Include PCR (Conventional and Real-time)
- > Update vaccine's section
 - > Injectable
 - > Oral use (Wildlife, dog, baits)



Conclusions

- > Key for Global harmonization of disease control
- > Based on latest scientific evidence (open for revision at all times)
- Inclusive and democratic revision
- Standards to be incorporate in the national legal framework
- > Responsibility of Countries to provide scientifically justified comments.
