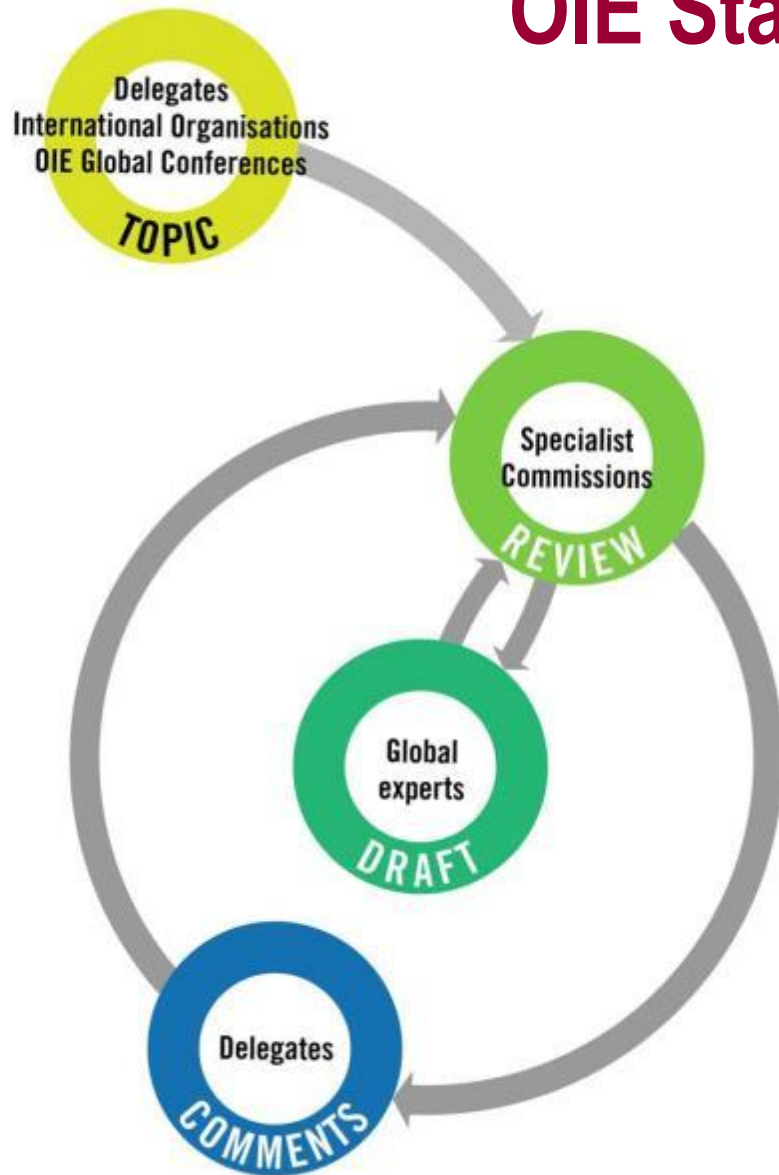

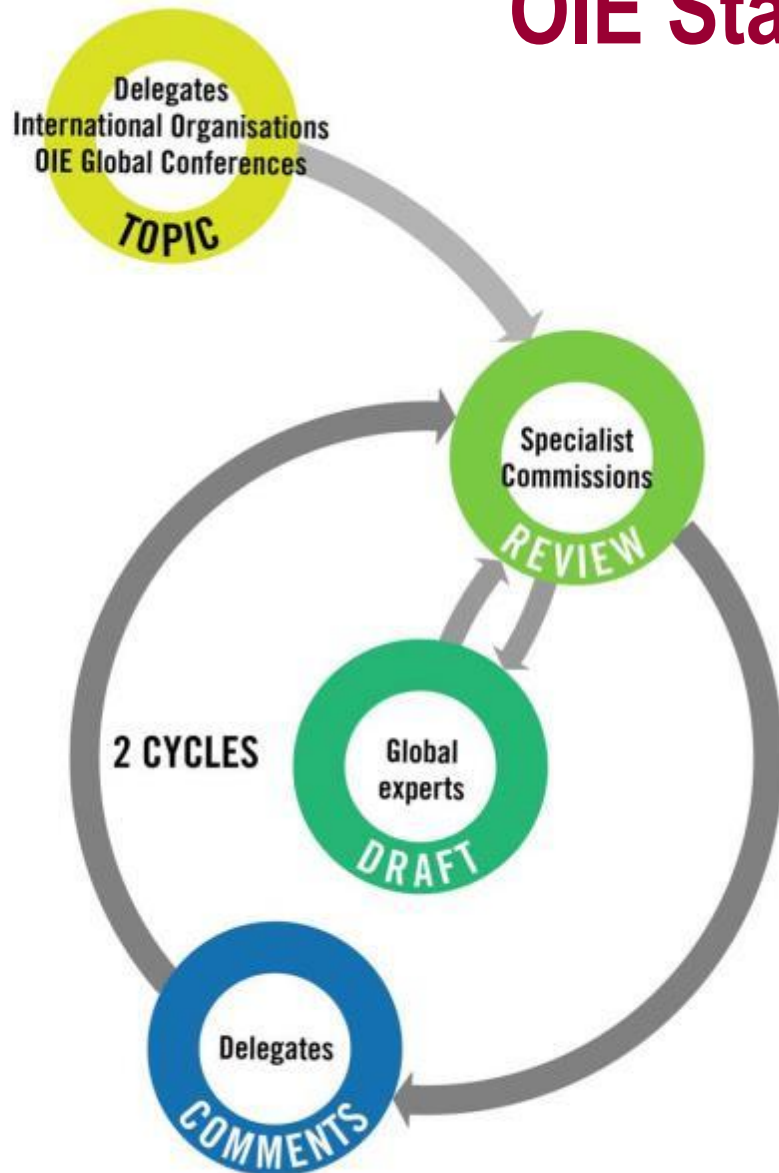

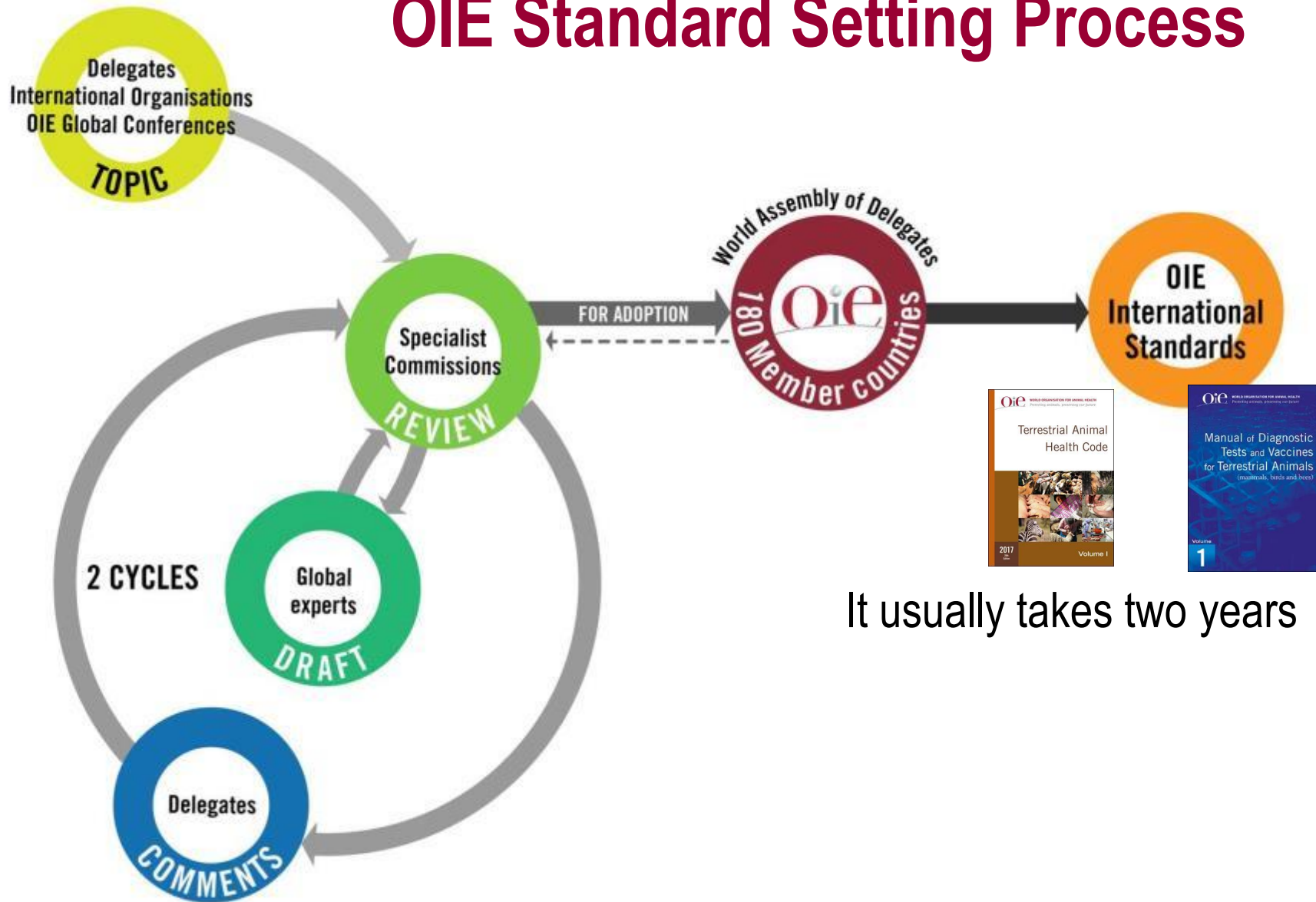

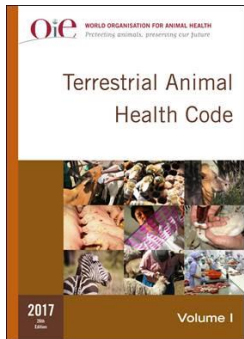


Terrestrial Code Chapter 7.7.

- Recommendations to deal with stray and feral dogs
- Integral part of rabies elimination programme
- Controlling dog populations without causing unnecessary animal suffering
- Veterinary Services should play a lead role

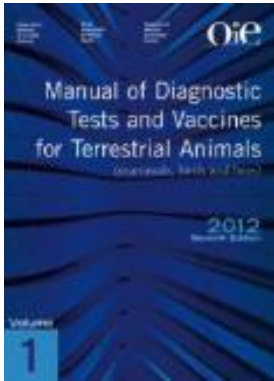

- > Full revision
- > Update existing diagnostic tests
- > Include direct rapid immunohistochemistry test (dRIT)
- > Include PCR (Conventional and Real-time)
- > Update vaccine's section
 - > Injectable
 - > Oral use (Wildlife, dog, baits)

- › Key for Global harmonization of disease control
- › Based on latest scientific evidence (open for revision at all times)
- › Inclusive and democratic revision
- › Standards to be incorporate in the national legal framework
- › Responsibility of Countries to provide scientifically justified comments.
