
OBJECTIVES AND TIMELINES

Zanzibar has a Compréhensive Multi-Sectoral Cholera Elimination Plan which was developed Under the leadership of the Second Vice President Office.

The overall Objective of the Zanzibar Comprehensive Cholera Elimination Plan (ZACCEP) is to eliminate local transmission of cholera in Zanzibar within a 10-year period (2018/19-2027/28).

- Objectives:
- To create and sustain an enabling environment for the elimination of cholera (Multi-sectoral coordination, Policy, Regulations, building capacity of sectors; allocation of domestic resources etc...)
- To intensify the implementation of cholera prevention interventions (safe water supply, sanitation, oral cholera vaccine, social and behavioural change mobilization)
- To strengthen and build resilient systems to respond to an outbreak of cholera (case management, surveillance, logistics and supplies. institutional of relevant sectors to respond


IMPLEMENTATION



CAPACITIES AND GAPS

- Early warning/Surveillance system: In the context of strengthening the IHR core capacity the MOH has conducted Joint External Evaluation (JEE), gaps identified and addressing the gaps has already started. Capacity building, provision of IT equipment, strengthening laboratory system
- The Government has decentralized three sectors (Health, Education and Agriculture) to be managed by local government and local authorities. Capacity building and fund allocation to lower levels is underway. This will create ownership and commitment at lower levels
- Hotspots in Zanzibar are identified. 40 Shehiyas out of 136 and Fishing camps will be targeted for intensified interventions in the coming three years (Early Detection and Response, WASH interventions, Oral Cholera Vaccine (OCV), Surveillance etc...). This will be reviewed and more vulnerable shehias will be targeted depending on the circumstances
- National multisectoral cholera elimination plan for Zanzibar is aligned to the GTFCC roadmap (Early Detection and Response, Multi-Sectoral approach to targeted Shehias and a High Level Coordination Mechanism to coordinate, Technical Assistance, mobilize resources, engage community and local leaders, local and international NGOs and other partners)
- Availability of funds: Government of Zanzibar has allocated 115,673,000 USD (92 million a loan from Exim Bank and 23,673,000 from African Development Bank, World Bank for water drainage and sanitation infrastructure)
- Existence of Disaster Management department at the Second Vice President Office which came up with a Multi-Sectoral Disaster Management Committee and a Cholera Technical Task Force to develop a Comprehensive Cholera Elimination Plan. MOH has a Directorate of Preventive Services and Health Promotion to coordinate and assign focal persons for Cholera elimination in Zanzibar.
- Cross sectoral collaboration: The second vice president office coordinates the multi-sectoral collaboration and coordination among various sectors (MOH, Ministry of Water and Environment, Water Authority, Municipality, Ministry of Information, Ministry of Education,
- GAPS: Human resources to follow-up the development of sectoral plans and its implementation, Water and Sanitation Expert, financial resources for water and sanitation infrastructure in hot spots not addressed by the ongoing projects
