
Supporting the implementation of the cholera roadmap at country level




Our strategic aims

Our four aims are based on our assessment of how we can best influence change.



Overview:

- WaterAid's Global Strategy aligns with the cholera roadmap
- Development NGO Support implementation of roadmap in endemic cholera settings
- Contribute to raising profile of cholera as both a health & WASH sector issue
- Focus on 4-5 countries (East & Southern Africa) in short term to understand what works, our added value & document experience and learning



Activities to date:

- Zanzibar:
 - Developing 3 year project to support WASH components of national cholera elimination plan in 5 identified hotspots in Zanzibar
 - Includes 4 components: behaviour change, faecal sludge management & sanitation, safe water at household level & institutional WASH (HCF, schools)
 - Generate & document evidence on effectiveness of WASH in elimination of cholera
- Mozambique:
 - Developing pilot project hygiene promotion & OCV (KOICA & IVI) in Cuamba district
 - Targeting other WASH programmes to the same district to ensure comprehensive approach
 - Training district & national officials from MoH on WaterAid's approach to hygiene behaviour change (BCD approach)



Activities to date:

- Zambia
 - Lusaka outbreak:
 - In partnership with MoH and NGO WASH forum, training 50 volunteers in hygiene promotion to conduct door-to-door visits in Chipata sub-district of Lusaka
 - Support MoH with water quality monitoring through mWater & provision of rapid water quality testing kits
 - > Training 160 teachers in monitoring WASH in schools & hygiene promotion focused on cholera
 - Coordinating NGO response with government (ensuring distribution of NGO efforts among affected districts)
 - Longer term engagement:
 - > Developing MoU with Ministry of Health to plan for longer-term involvement
 - Working with UNICEF to mobilise Ministry responsible for WASH
- **Uganda:** Planning to integrate hygiene promotion into OCV introduction later in 2018



Various roles at country level:

1. Technical/capacity building & implementing partner

- \circ Supporting implementation of WASH components of cholera plan
- \circ $\,$ Advising on different WASH strategies in particular settings $\,$
- **o** Building capacity on hygiene behaviour change
- Integration of OCV & hygiene promotion piloting & demonstrating how this can be done

2. Convening & coordination

- Engaging WASH ministry and WASH stakeholders/funders/NGOs, and bring them into discussion on cholera, including in national planning processes
- Coordinating NGO responses with government

3. Policy & advocacy

- Raise profile of cholera as a cross-sectoral issue (engaging media, parliamentarians, other civil society networks)
- Driving political will in MoH and WASH sector (WHA resolution, SWA processes, SDGs)



Water

Challenges & Opportunities:

- Health is a relatively new organisational priority
 - Limited experience and capacity working with the health sector
 - Competing priorities, limited financial & human resources

But...

- Use cholera as way to raise political profile of WASH
- More systematically embed cholera as a WASH sector priority
 - Include cholera in SWA dialogue, SDG6 implementation plans
 - Use cholera as an indicator to inform WaterAid's own programming and targeting
 - Work with other GTFCC partners to form multi-country funding consortiums?
