C4D / RCCE: Preparedness and response



• Preparedness:

- Capacity development on risk communication and community engagement
- Evidence synthesis of social science lessons in Cholera control
- Technical support to national preparedness plans on RCCE
- Pre-positioning materials/tools

Response:

- Lead on RCCE with WHO, IFRC, Oxfam as per SRP
- Focus: life saving information, hygiene and OCV, accountability/feedback

Institutional presence:

- Creation of Community Engagement working group under GFTCC to guide NCPs
- Engagement with regional platforms in Africa region
- Global RCCE coordination activated for response and preparedness
 - · Capacity building
 - Synthesis of evidence



WASH: Preparedness and response

- Global WASH technical assistance and surge support:
 - Staff specializing in outbreaks for surge support
 - Cholera Investment Case
- Knowledge Management in collaboration with CDC:
 - Global Review of Rapid Response Teams (RRTs) in outbreak settings in 4 countries (Haiti, Nigeria, South Sudan and Yemen)
- Response:
 - Support to country offices
 - Global WASH Cluster leadership, WASH Cluster in country
- Institutional presence:
 - Strategic WASH support in leadership of global cholera control:
 - Chair of WASH WG since 2017 with a membership of over 70 partners, with funding support from CDC.



WASH WG major contributions

- <u>Technical guidance and support</u>: WASH and IPC in CTCs, WASH Package, funded consultancy for costed National Cholera Plans
- <u>Country level support</u>: GTFCC Framework for multi-sectoral NCPs, HR roster and deployment of WASH experts, technical review of OCV requests, training
- Research: alignment of WASH and cholera research agenda, funded consultancy for a research plan
- Advocacy: Cholera Investment Case, participation at key events, High Level Political Forum (HLPF), World Water Week, UNC's Health and Water conference



WASH: Upcoming projects

In collaboration with CDC and regional cholera platforms:

- Development and roll-out of Costed cholera prevention plan in 4 countries in Sub-Saharan Africa
- Optimising cholera research plan
- Review of countries that eliminated cholera in sub-Saharan Africa
- Community engagement study and development of guidance in WCAR
- Epidemiology trainings targeting WASH staff in collaboration with Global WASH Cluster
- Support to Information Management for ESAR and WCAR



Health: Global activities

- Strategic representations as members in GFTCC case management and OCV WGs
- Support development of Cholera Training App
- Technical review of 'Yellow Book'
- Developed, periodic updates and e-Learning of cholera Toolkit



Health: Country support

- Support ministries of health to strengthen cholera case management: DTCs, ORPs, SAM/cholera in Yemen, Somalia and Bangladesh/Rohingya
- Support capacity building of HWs
- Support IPC
- Support microplanning, supplies/cold chain, and implementation of OCV campaigns
- Part of integrated outbreak response, and community-based awareness/health promotion teams



Supply Division:

- Pre-position of cholera kits (at warehouse):
 - Periphery kit
 - Community kit
- Availability of kits on demand (under LTA):
 - Central reference kit
 - Hardware kit
- Availability of kits on demand via WHO (LTA):
 - Laboratory kit
 - Investigation kit
- OCV procurement and supply
- WASH supplies procurement
- Strengthening of supply chain systems (national and international)



MENARO: Preparedness

- Root causes of cholera through development programming.
 - Ensuring drinking water quality,
 - Improving sanitation practices and ending open defection
 - Behavioral change communications

Annual EPPs by all country offices

- including cholera preparedness plans
- prepositioning of supplies
- engagement with partners

Innovation for cholera prediction

- modelling of climate and rainfall patterns
- Capacity development action plan
 - Hygiene promotion and sanitation in schools linked with community-based interventions
 - Case management for Health and nutrition workers.
- Cholera prevention integrated into intersectoral C4D strategies.



MENARO: Response

Containment and prevention:

Yemen, Iraq and Sudan

WASH:

- emergency water provision,
- drinking water quality,
- operationalization of water and sanitation facilities,
- rehabilitation of WASH infrastructure,
- solid waste management,
- hygiene promotion, ending open defecation, etc

Case management:

Establishment of ORCs/CTCs

C4D:

- cholera behavioral evidence, Yemen
- Qualitative study FGDs + KIIs to understand the root causes of behaviors
- Quantitative KAP studies including elements on WASH practices, health seeking behaviors and/or small scale qualitative assessments.

Third Party Monitoring of hygiene practices:

- 5 key practices : self-reporting, proxies, observation
- monitoring of RRTs (HH engagement, hygiene practices, feedback)
- Third Party Monitoring of ORCs / CTCs.



MENARO: Current projects

- Online and e-learning, modules and mobile apps for capacity-building of health care, WASH and C4D field workers.
- Advocacy with Governments on cholera risk factors, appropriate prevention means, effective response activities, etc
- Generation of data in Social and Behavior change for evidence-based community engagement (who to talk to, how, about what), monitoring uptake of practices, risk & transmission analysis, decision-making, accountability, feedback, etc
- Country Offices develop and regularly update social and behavior change strategies to guide the community engagement components.
- Launch of MENA Regional Cholera Platform with UNICEF and WHO co-lead.
 - First meeting to launch the platform planned for March/April 2019. No dedicated funding secured as yet for the Cholera Platform





Regional platform: West and Central Africa

Past

- 2012: Regional platform launched officially
- ECHO financial support (2013 et 2018)
- From late 2013: 2 staffs (cholera expert + IM) dedicated to cholera platform within UNICEF regional office
- Implementation of "shield and sword strategy"
- Co-lead of the platform by WHO
- Annual cost: 600.000 USD for staff and activities

Present (2018 – 2019)

- Alignment with GTFCC roadmap and objectives
- UNICEF and WHO at regional level working closely together (workplan, share responsibilities according to expertise...)
- UNICEF thematic funds in 2019 (90.000 USD until June 2019) + CDC support (82.500 USD in 2019) including "research on Community Engagement" and "IM position"

FUTURE (from 2020)

- Platform integrated with GTFCC as operational body liaising and supporting countries of the region
- Platform promoting GTFCC tools and strategy
- Cholera Website integrated (between platform themselves and within GTFCC)
- Funds available to support operationalization of the roadmap (support NCP, monitor progress, organize trainings...).





Regional Platform: West and Central Africa

Preparedness and Response to outbreak

- •3 cholera alerts on average per year
- •80% of main outbreaks supported through direct field support
- •Realtime webmap of cholera in the region
- •Cholera platform has created a list of cholera experts (Rosters)
- •Contingency funds at regional level used to boost first response or cover main gaps (100.000 USD allocated to countries in 2018)

Long-term prevention in cholera hotspots

- •12 country profiles (called cholera factsheets)
- •14 countries' maps of cholera hotspots
- •7 countries where <u>WASH investment plans</u> have been established
- •Regional strategy established and aligned with GTFCC's roadmap.
- •13 countries supported in the elaboration of "National Cholera Control Plans" or/and "Emergency and Response plan"
- "WASH and OCV monitoring tool" in 2018 to follow-up on progress toward the roadmap per hotspots


information Management and Knowledge exchange

- •Almost 20.000 visitors per year on the cholera <u>platform</u> website
- •49 cholera's studies/research produced (compendium)
- •246 organisations through more than 1000 people receive communications
- •126 bi-monthly cholera updates
- •26 regional maps and infographics
- •8 crossborders workshops
- •4 regional trainings organised and 11 national trainings
- •24 cholera platform meetings



Regional Platform: Eastern and Southern Africa

- Strong interest from Health and WASH partners in Eastern and Southern Africa to strengthen the regional platform approach as a way to provide direct support to countries of the region
- UNICEF support to Regional platform approach so far includes:
 - monthly bulletins on cholera outbreaks and response
 - hot spot mapping studies done in 2018 and one additional study commissioned for Great Lakes countries and Tanzania in 2019
 - Integration of Cholera website with WCAR platform in 2018 (http://www.plateformecholera.info/)
