Vaccination & case management

- Vaccination
 - Preventive – reactive and in humanitarian settings
 - Around 2.4 million doses in the following countries: Cameroon, Ethiopia, Mozambique, Nigeria, Uganda
 - Activities included: support to requests, support to micro plan, support cold chain management, vaccination implementation, logistic support according to needs
- No vaccination possible in some situations
- MSF in the ICG
 - more vaccine availability and access
 - decision mechanism based on public health criteria
- Treatment:
 - More than 50 000 patients treated in the following countries: DRC, Kenya, Mozambique, Niger, Nigeria, Uganda, Yemen
 - Activities included: setting up of CTC, supplies, training, direct and indirect involvement in case management
- Water provision and waste management in treatment centers and on vaccination sites

Specific WASH activities in Harare - Zimbabwe

- Objective: To participate to the prevention of cholera and typhoid cases in selected high risk area in Harare
 - Provision of safe water
 - Community ownership for management and maintenance
 - Community based case surveillance
- Implementation between Jan 2015 to February 2019
 - Boreholes have been rehabilitated
 - New boreholes have been drilled with an innovative technique
 - Community Health Club have been identified and trained to manage and maintain the boreholes
 - Multi sector Officials have been involved and trained
 - New specifications for boreholes have been developed with the local academic sector, and revised standards have been proposed by national authorities (final adoption of the new standards pending)

Specific WASH activities in Harare - Zimbabwe

- Community surveillance during 2018
 - Less cases in household using water from boreholes
 - Increased use of water coming from safe sources
- Toolkit developed
 - Videos and printed materials have been developed to target different audiences (authorities, population) in collaboration with local partners
- Next steps:
 - Extension of the geographical zone in Zimbabwe
 - Discussion with national authorities to extend in Nsange - Malawi and Cabo Delgado - Mozambique




