




From preparedness and response to prevention and control

Treating patients alone has limited impact on transmission



UNPRECEDENTED ENGAGEMENT OF COUNTRIES

- Zambia, Zanzibar and Zimbabwe are launching their elimination plans
- DRC, Nigeria, Somalia, South Sudan and Yemen are implementing large scale OCV campaigns
- Bangladesh has submitted a multi-sectoral cholera control plan
- Bangladesh, Ethiopia and Sudan now declare "ch





CHOLERA CASES REPORTED TO WHO


- 2018: 497,042 cholera cases and 2982 deaths reported to WHO worldwide
 - 60% decrease compared to 2017
- Excluding Yemen: 125,716 cases and 2477 deaths reported
 - 35% decrease in the number of cases and a 27% decrease in the number of deaths compared to 2017
- WHO African Region : 37% decrease in cholera cases and 25% decrease in cholera deaths compared with 2017 figures

NUMBER OF OCV DOSES SHIPPED TO COUNTRIES PER YEAR




VACCINATION POST CYCLONE IDAI IN SOFALA PROVINCE, MOZAMBIQUE – 2019

Number of Cholera Cases in Sofala Province, Mozambique, 25 March to 20 May, 2019




THE OUTBREAK IN HARARE, ZIMBABWE WAS CONTROLLED WITHIN 2 MONTHS




THE TRANSMISSION STOPPED IN SOUTH SUDAN SINCE END OF 2017

- 2017: 12174 cases,
 288 deaths reported
- 2019: 1583 cases, 22 deaths reported
- 9.3 M doses of OCV shipped for campaigns in Adamawa, Bauchi, Borno, Yobe states



- Some countries are not yet engaged
- Some countries don't engage on WaSH after successivaccination
- The surveillance of cholera is not standardised and t vast majority of «cholera cases» are «suspect»
- •We are not entirely clear on where to shoot in all cour
- •We remain short of vaccine supply



THE WAY FORWARD

- Get on board those countries not yet engaged (advocacy)
- Further develop the GTFCC operational model for a better country support (Country Support Platform)
- Ensure strategic vaccine supply, taylored to the needs and used in a strategic / preventive manner
- Support countries to implement the roadmap
 - Reinforce countries surveillance capacities+++
 - Before, during and after OCV campaigns
 - Bridge OCV and WaSH
 - Target hotspots for sustainable WaSH interventions
