RABIES VACCINATION CAMPAIGN BIKITA DISTRICT MASVINGO EAST

In April, VAWZ Inspectors, together with staff from the Department of Veterinary Services, carried out a further Rabies Vaccination Campaign in the Nyika area of Bikita District, following up on the previous campaign held there in September last year.

To encourage a better turnout, it was decided to hold the campaign during the school holidays as often it is the children that are tasked with bringing their dogs. This proved successful and the number of dogs vaccinated increased to 2172 from the previous figure of 969.

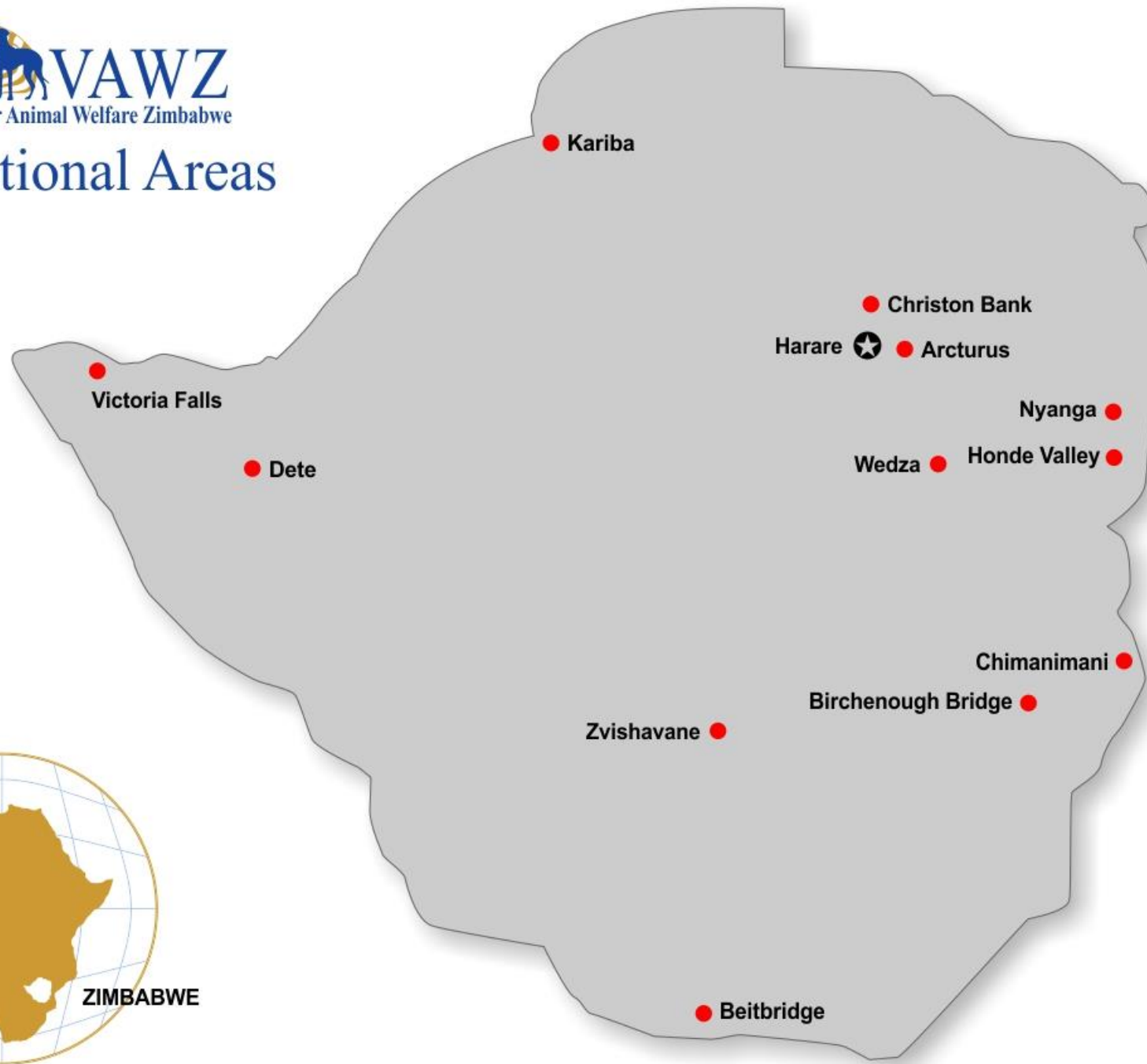

3 MILLION DOGS

Is Zimbabwe's estimated dog population. And growing.

Most of these are rural dogs, where communities have little access to veterinary treatments. Outbreaks of rabies, canine distemper & parvo virus put animals and communities lives at risk.

As part of VAWZ programs to help manage domestic animal populations, we are planning a **STERILIZATION & VACCINATION CAMPAIGN** in Kariba, where feral dog numbers are currently rising unchecked and becoming a concern.

We intend holding one-day clinics in Nyamhunga township, Mahombekombe township, Chawara industrial area, and the Heights suburbs, and will encourage communities to bring in their animals for treatments. **These initiatives are well attended and our work makes a real impact ***
